FRENCH WINE GROWERS LOCATIONS –

Burgundy

This region is best known for producing Burgundy reds from pinot noir grapes. Their white wine is made from the Chardonnay grapes. The main wine making areas are Chablis, Cote D'Or, Cote Chalonnaise, Macon and Beaujolais.

Bordeaux

Best known for the full bodied wines known is Claret

Champagne

This world famous brand known is Champagne, come from the northeast of Paris and has been the centre for what is arguably France's best-known wine since the 17th century when the innovative monk Dom Pierre Pérignon perfected a technique for making sparkling wine.

Loire Valley

This region produces the greatest variety of wine in France and is best known for rosé. The most common grapes are the Muscadet, cabernet franc and chenin lanc. The most famous area is Pouilly-Fumé, Vouvray, Sancerre, Bourgueil, Chinon and Saumur

Languedoc

This is the country's most productive wine-growing region, with up to 40% of France's wine – mainly cheap red table wine – produced here. About 1,550 miles of the region is "under vine", which represents just over a third of France's total.

Alsace

This region is known for its Riesling, gewürztraminer, pinot Gris and the Muscat d'Alsace.

Rhône region

The south (Mediterranean climate) and north Rhone (continental climate) produce extremely different wines due to this difference in climate. The northern vineyards produce red wines exclusively from the ruby-red Syrah (Shiraz) grape. The south is better known for quantity rather the quality.
